At-Home Tests

Our tests offer simple sample collection from home and on each person's time.



Microalbumin Test

The at-home Microalbumin test uses a small urine sample to detect levels of albumin (a blood protein) in the urine. The test is used to detect early signs of kidney damage.



A1C

A1C can identify prediabetes, which raises the risk for diabetes, and it can be used to screen for diabetes. And it is used to monitor how well diabetes treatment is working overtime. It is also a critical step in forming a game plan to manage diabetes with the diabetes care team.



FIT Test

The non-invasive Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) is a simple way to screen for the presence of blood in stool to proactively identify colon cancer.
