



## Chronic Condition Coding Awareness: **Autistic Disorder**

### **Autistic Disorder**

Autism is a brain disorder that limits a person's ability to communicate and relate to other people<sup>2</sup>. Also known as autism spectrum disorder (ASD), the term "spectrum" reflects the wide variation in challenges and strengths possessed by each person<sup>1</sup>. Some people can navigate their world, some have exceptional abilities, while others struggle to speak<sup>2</sup>.

### **Symptoms of Autism**

Signs of ASD tend to appear between 2 and 3 years of age and can include repeated motions and/or words, avoiding eye contact or physical touch, delays in learning to talk, and getting upset by minor changes<sup>2</sup>. Additionally, some people with autism can experience physical symptoms such as constipation, sleep problems, poor coordination of muscles, and seizures<sup>2</sup>. These signs, however, can also occur in children without ASD and at any age<sup>1,2</sup>. It is important that caregivers talk with a healthcare provider to request a screening for autism.

### **Treatment of Autism**

Treatment for ASD is dependent on screening results. A diagnosis of autism is not needed for people to begin receiving services related to developmental delays or learning challenges<sup>1</sup>. Nonetheless treatments offered include behavior programs, individualized education program (IEP), medication, sensory processing, assistive technology, and diet<sup>2</sup>.

➤ <b>Use additional code...</b>	... to identify any associated <u>medical condition</u> such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Constipation</li> <li>○ Sleep problems</li> <li>○ Poor coordination of muscles</li> <li>○ Seizures</li> </ul> ...and intellectual disabilities such as <u>IQ</u> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <i>F70</i>    Mild (IQ 50-69)</li> <li>○ <i>F71</i>    Moderate (IQ 35-49)</li> <li>○ <i>F72</i>    Severe (IQ 20-34)</li> <li>○ <i>F73</i>    Profound (IQ under 20)</li> <li>○ <i>F78</i>    Other intellectual disabilities</li> <li>○ <i>F79</i>    Unspecified intellectual disabilities</li> <li>○ <i>R41.83</i> Borderline intellectual functioning (IQ above 70-84)</li> </ul>
➤ <b>Avoid terms such as "history of"...</b>	... if patient is still being monitored for the condition. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ <u>Incorrect</u> wording: <i>Patient has <u>history of</u> autism.</i></li> <li>○ <u>Correct</u> wording: <i>Patient has autism and continues medication.</i></li> </ul>

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<p>➤ <b>Documentation &amp; Coding Tips</b></p>	<p>The following language supports actively monitoring [any] condition and must be documented by the provider. In the documentation, mention...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ if the patient is receiving therapy.</li> <li>○ getting a refill on medication.</li> <li>○ the status of the condition.</li> </ul>
<p>➤ <b>HEDIS Tip</b></p>	<p>Patients who were hospitalized either in the emergency room or inpatient for treatment of autistic disorders should have a follow-up visit with a mental health practitioner within 7 days and then at 30 days post discharge.<sup>4</sup></p>
